




DISTINGUISHED PROFESSIONAL SERVICE AWARD

CALL FOR NOMINATIONS

Nominations close March 31 at 5 pm ET annually.







- 1. Open nominations are held via an annual call out to membership.
- 2. The Membership Growth and Services Committee reviews applications received by the deadline of March 31 annually and selects an appropriate recipient to recommend for Board approval prior to the AGM. The Board alone has authority to grant the award.
- 3. In the case where no applications are received, the Membership Growth and Services Committee may select a member if they deem an individual deserving or the Committee may choose not to award the Distinguished Professional Service Award in a given year.
- 4. The National Office arranges for a certificate and, where appropriate, an invitation to the recipient to receive their award.
- 5. Awards will be presented at the CGIC AGM annually.
